Prime Professional Services for Hawk Island Boardwalk Replacement ~

Mr. Morgan stated we interviewed four bidders out of the ten vendors who submitted proposals. Mr. Morgan stated we recommend Rowe Professional, who is the lowest bidder.

<u>RESOLUTION #8-20 TO RECOMMEND AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH ROWE</u> <u>PROFESSIONAL SERVICES COMPANY FOR THE HAWK ISLAND BOARDWALK</u> <u>REPLACEMENT PROJECT</u>

WHEREAS, proposals were solicited from registered architects, professional engineers and/or landscape architects for the purpose of entering into a contract to provide prime professional services for the Hawk Island Boardwalk Replacement project; and

WHEREAS, after careful review and evaluation of the proposals received, the Evaluation Committee recommends that a contract be awarded to ROWE Professional Services Company.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Park & Recreation Commission recommends that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners hereby approves entering into a contract with ROWE Professional Services Company for the base bid in the amount of \$38,900 to provide prime professional services for the Hawk Island Boardwalk Replacement project, up to

and not to exceed \$5,000 for reimbursements for the wetland delineation or threatened and endangered species investigation, \$423 (3%) price increase for Phase 2 of the project if it is extended through 2023 for a total amount not to exceed of \$44,323, and authorizes a contingency for the overall all work not to exceed 20% of their base bid or \$7,780 for a total of \$52,103.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the contract with ROWE Professional Services Company shall be effective the date of execution through March 1, 2021 for Phase 1 to assist in writing grants to obtain funds necessary to complete the project and through December 31, 2023 for Phase 2.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, there are funds available in line item 228-62800-967000-TR084.

Snow Making Pipe for Hawk Island ~

Mr. Collins stated we had a company, Ratnik Industries, look at our existing pipe, and the engineer recommended this pipe. The pipe is from Austria and it has a cement case and a 75 year lifetime. Mr. Collins stated there is hot soil (very corrosive) at Hawk Island, and the engineer recommend this specialty pipe which should last a lot longer and does not require welding.

RESOLUTION #9-20 TO RECOMMEND AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH PNP SUPPLY LLC AS A SOLE SOURCE VENDOR FOR THE SNOW MAKING PIPE AT HAWK ISLAND

WHEREAS, there has been significant corrosion on the existing snow making pipe at Hawk Island; and

WHEREAS, proposals were solicited for a new snow making pipe at Hawk Island; and

WHEREAS, PNP Supply LLC out of Englewood, Colorado is a sole source vendor for this type of pipe in North America.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Park & Recreation Commission recommends that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners approve entering into a contract with PNP Supply LLC in the total amount not to exceed \$31,633 for the new snow making pipe at Hawk Island.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the contract with PNP Supply LLC shall be effective the date of execution through March 1,2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners authorizes \$31,633 from the Parks Department 208 fund balance for the project and the Controller/Administrator is authorized to transfer \$31,633 from the Parks Department 208 fund balance into line item 208-75600-818000.

Contract with J.H. Construction for Concrete Work at Hawk Island ~

Mr. Collins stated the concrete work would be done in the area near the playground at Hawk Island. This area has old concrete and woodchips and it is not ADA accessible. This contract would rip out the old concrete and woodchips, and replace it with more ADA compliant surfaces.

<u>RESOLUTION #10-20 TO RECOMMEND AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH JH</u></u> <u>CONSTRUCTION FOR CONCRETE WORK AT HAWK ISLAND COUNTY PARK</u>

WHEREAS, staff solicited proposals from qualified and experienced contractors for the purpose of entering into a contract for concrete work at Hawk Island County Park; and

WHEREAS, staff worked with the Purchasing Department to ensure the project is in compliance with the prevailing wage rates; and

WHEREAS, after careful review and evaluation of the proposals received, the Evaluation Committee recommends that a contract be awarded to JH Construction.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Park & Recreation Commission recommends that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners hereby approves entering into a contract with JH Construction for a total amount not to exceed of \$16,403.60 for concrete work at Hawk Island County Park.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this agreement shall be effective the date of execution through November 30, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are funds available in line item 228-75999-974000-20P13 for the project.

<u>RESOLUTION #11-20 TO RECOMMEND AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE</u> <u>CONTRACT WITH SPICER GROUP, INC.</u>

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners passed Resolution 16-524 to authorize a two year contract with Spicer Group Inc., for the purpose of providing consulting services to and assisting the Ingham County Parks staff of millage related items; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners passed Resolution 18-469 authorized extending the contract by two years; and

WHEREAS, an additional \$57,000 from the Trails and Parks Millage fund balance will be necessary to complete additional tasks within the current contract scope.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ingham County Park & Recreation Commission recommends that the Ingham County Board of Commissioners authorizes an Amendment to the

Contract with Spicer Group, Inc. to provide additional consulting services to and assist the Ingham County Parks staff with the delivery of certain millage related items within the current contract scope, to include providing validating cost estimates are accurate, project viability reporting, follow-up and monitoring of projects, post audit completion, bridge and engineering expertise, wayfinding program, professional services design and grants assistance, and mapping and updates to the comprehensive report as needed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners authorize an additional not to exceed \$57,000 from the Trails and Parks Millage fund balance and the Controller is authorized to transfer \$57,000 from the Trails and Parks Millage fund balance into line item # 228-62800-802000.

Mr. Morgan stated the Parks Department 2021 Controller's recommended budget had some clerical errors, and Mr. Townsend will announce the corrections at the Human Services Committee this evening. Mr. Morgan stated the Controller's recommended budget proposes replacing the operating budgets for Hawk Island, Burchfield Park and Lake Lansing Parks with millage funds. The Admin budget will remain funded from the general fund. This will be discussed at the Human Services Committee meeting. Commissioner Stivers said we are facing tough budget decisions and are looking at other ways to raise the money for shortfalls, but we may have to use the millage. Commissioner Stivers said it is either that, or possible layoffs which they are trying to avoid. Discussion.

Mr. Morgan stated we had come up with proposed cost savings earlier in the year, and we should be on track to adhere to this, however there will be a shortfall on revenue. Mr. Morgan stated we are not renting pedal boats, we lost revenue on shelter rentals early in the season, etc.

RE: Northern Tier Trail Connection through White Park Trails Millage Project #TR033

Good day Commissioners:

At the January 13 Ingham County Parks Commission meeting, City of East Lansing staff provided the Commission with an update on Trails Millage Project TR#033, the Northern Tier Trail extension through White Park. Staff from the East Lansing Department of Parks and Recreation shared with you that designing a trail crossing at the Lake Lansing Road/Towar Avenue intersection was proving to be more complicated and costly than originally anticipated. This was due to the number of entities with jurisdiction over various aspects of this intersection, as well as the physical limitations of the existing traffic signalization equipment.

East Lansing representatives indicated that there were to two primary options for the road crossing: the location originally proposed at the intersection of Towar Avenue and Biber Street; or a mid-block crossing in the vicinity of the entrance to White Park. Both options were estimated to have a much greater expense than was originally estimated, \$375,000 and \$175,000 respectively.

The Park Commission requested that East Lansing evaluate the road crossing options and return to the Commission with a proposal. After considerable interaction with the Ingham County Road Department and communication with East Lansing Department of Public Works and Meridian Township Engineering staff, it was determined that the best approach to improve pedestrian safety at this intersection was a reconfiguration and reconstruction of the intersection.

Attached is preliminary design and estimate of probable cost for the intersection improvements. The design and estimate of probable cost include the following components:

- Remove the slip-lane on east-bound Lake Lansing Road;
- Replacement of all traffic signals including poles, wires, sensors and lights;
- Installation of pedestrian activated crossing signals, wireless vehicle sensors, and audible crossing signals;
- Installation of ADA crossing ramps and detectable plates;
- Site restoration, restriping and signage; and,
- Engineering and construction contingency.

(517) 337-1731 Fax (517) 337-1559 www.cityofeastlansing.com The estimate of probable cost as provided by the City of East Lansing Traffic Consultant Bergmann Associates, is \$355,568 which includes funds for project engineering and a contingency. However, it does not appear to include adequate funds for concrete work that may be necessary to connect existing walkways to the ADA ramps. Therefore, the City of East Lansing would like to request a project amendment to allocate an additional \$375,000 from the Ingham County Trails Millage to Trails Millage Project #TR033 Northern Tier Trail Connection through White Park to conduct pedestrian safety improvements to the Lake Lansing Road/Towar Avenue intersection.

Staff from the City of East Lansing Department of Parks and Recreation will be in attendance at the September 21, Parks Commission meeting to address any questions about this request. 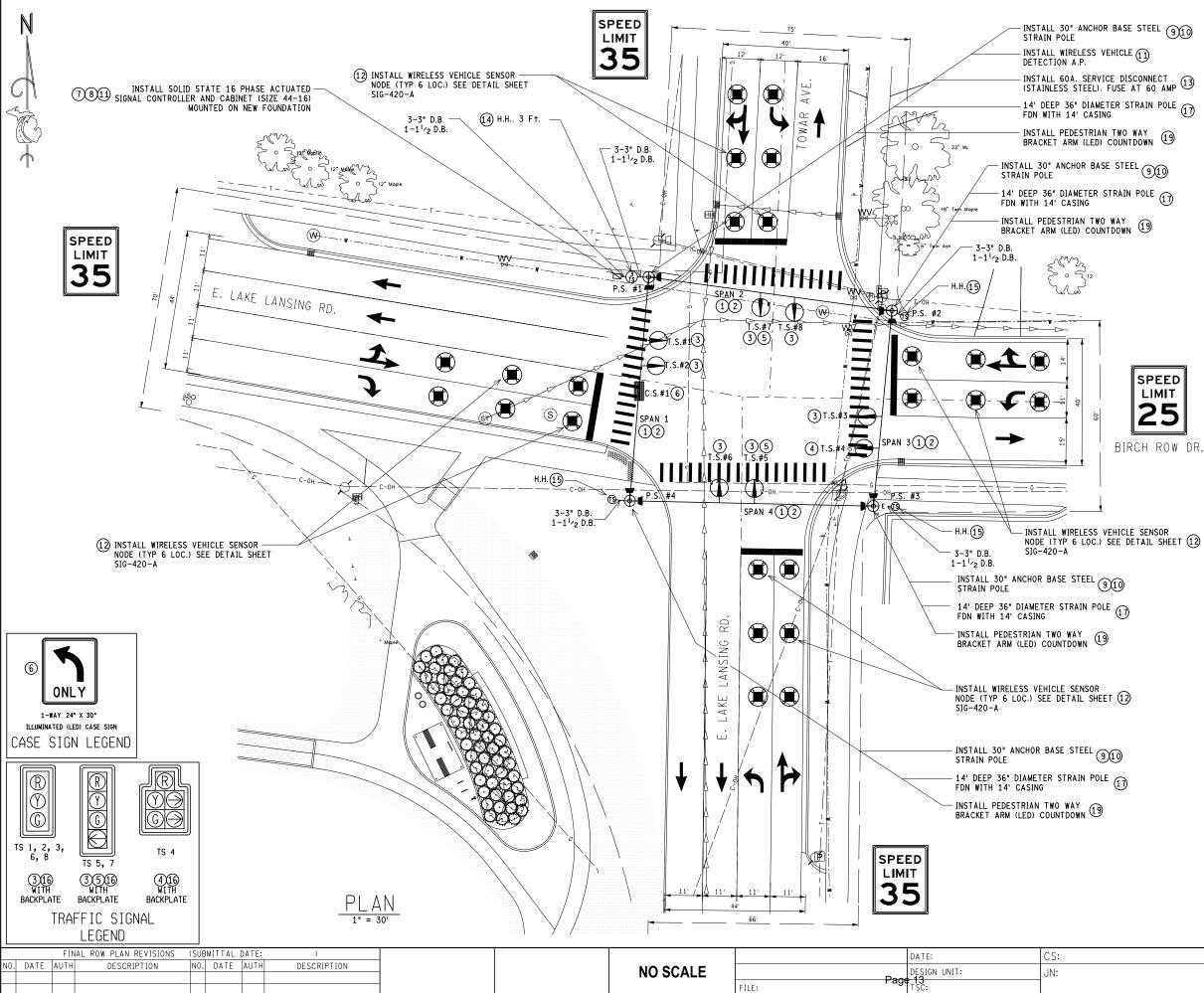

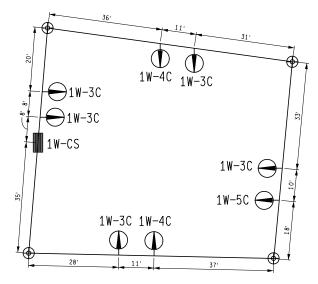

Directors Report 2020 August 19th- September 16, 2020 (September 21st Park Commission meeting)

<u>Mission Statement:</u> The Ingham County Parks & Recreation Commission and Ingham County Parks Department will provide quality outdoor recreation opportunities and facilities for all segments of our population. We will strive to enhance the quality of life for park visitors and county residents through active citizen involvement, planned acquisition, preservation and professional management of park lands.

- Met with the new County Controller Gregg Todd and took him on a tour of the Ingham County Parks.
- Attended direct report meeting with the Controller's office via zoom.
- Continued ongoing weekly update phone meetings with Nicole, Emma and Melissa on various committee agendas, supporting documents and internal items, and resolutions.
- Worked with the Mangers on several CIP project RFP's and Grant RFP's for Prime professional.
- Ongoing responded to, sorted, and organized paperwork, files and e-mails.
- Staff continues working on 2020 approved CIP projects for year-end approvals.
- Visited the parks weekly.
- Conducted zoom interviews with the Mangers and Human Resources for the Park Ranger Position that was approved to hire after the millage renewed in March of this year. At the time of this report we still have not made a decision of our hiring for this position.
- Went to Burchfield and checked in on our Land and Water Accessibility and facilities rehab as well as Easy Dock work to be done still this fall by Laux Construction. Much work is getting underway and all put installing the easy-dock in the river next Spring should be completed this fall. This is similar ADA improvements and updates to facilities that was done as part of a MNRTF grant at LLN last year.
- Attended community site visits with Melissa, Tanya, and Park Commissioners as well as presented the ICP projects to them for the Millage applications for the 6th round.
- Attended a Millage Consultant update meeting with Melissa and Tanya.
- Worked with Melissa updating the next RFP for the Trails and Parks Millage consultant as Spicer Contract expires in December and we will be soliciting for the next six years of the renewal millage for additional consultant's services. We have been very happy with Spicer group and the work they have done so far. We are required to put contracts back out on the street after two renewals. Spicer is in their second phase of four years of millage work.
- Worked with Tim Buckley, Chris Washer, Coe Emens and Ian Londo for a few change orders for the two grants we are presently working on at both LLS and Burchfield parks.
- Helped with packets and agendas for Park Commission meetings.
- Attended several BOC committee meeting via zoom.

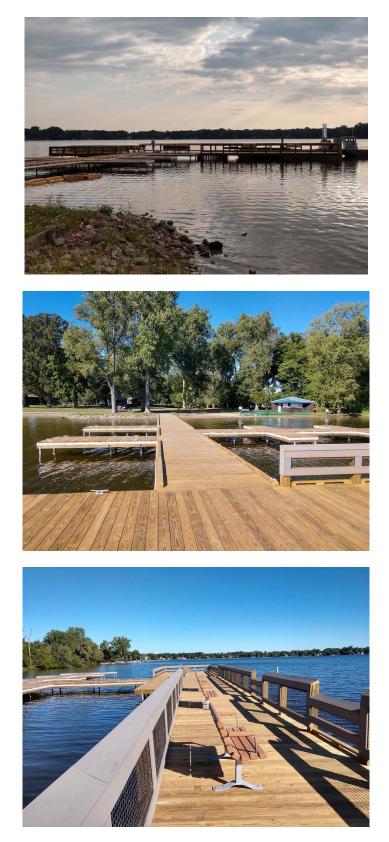

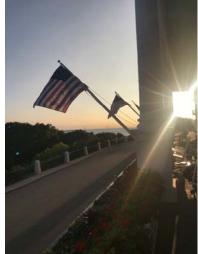
